#### **3.2 WEBSITE/MEMBERSHIP UPDATE**

- DOT(WA) Exec would like to thank everyone for their understanding into the membership issues we have been facing this year. While we believe it has caused no/limited issue to members we understand it has caused some confusion.
- Due to the disruption of membership, when membership renewal opens for this membership year (July '16- June'17) we will be charging \$35 for standard membership and \$30 for WAOTA members. If people have joined DOT(WA) since 1<sup>st</sup> January '17 as a new member and NOT received a discount for the Play and Learning PD, we will credit members the difference in membership price towards their membership being extended until the end of June '18.
- DOT(WA) Exec have been discussing membership fees and fees will rise for the July '17-June'18 membership year. DOT(WA) annual membership fees will now be \$60, with a fee of \$55 for WAOTA members (that is a \$10 per year rise for all members).
- At today's meeting, it was discussed how members would prefer to paid membership; either for 'now' until the end of June '17 or from 'now' until end of June '18. Those present (25 people) agreed that it was preferred to register until the end of 2018 rather than having to register now and then again in July for the next year.
