7. DOT(WA) AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN PAEDIATRIC OT

This years DOT(WA) Award for Excellence in Paediatrics was awarded to Kate Keisler. Kate is the owner of Calm and Connected, a private practice with a keen interest in fostering self-regulation skills in children, teens and young adults. She also supervises both students and practicing OTs to help support their skill development. Kate has also been a supporter of DOT(WA) and is always willing to offer her thoughts during meetings. She also presented at the March 2016 DOT(WA) meeting, to share her knowledge on theories across disciplines related to self regulation.

In more recent times, Kate has developed Camp Confidence. The camp is based on Camp Jabiru in Sydney and is an innovative service in WA. The camp is for 8-11 year olds with self regulation difficulties. It aims to support the development of confidence socially and emotionally. The camp is also an opportunity for OTs and OT students to learn more about self regulation. She also runs events such as 'Girls Night' to foster independence, self regulation, social skills and confidence in those that attend. Kate is also about to launch an online 4 part learning series with Jackie Pierle called "How to go From Survival Brain to Thinking Mode" which focuses on assisting children with self regulation difficulties following trauma.
