5.3 RESEARCH

- Currently re-evaluating ways to increase interest in research.
- Historically, journal club has not been well attended.
 ACTION DOT(WA) members can direct any ideas to DOT(WA) re: ideas for research.
- Kathryn expressed interest re: finding OTs interested in researching the secret code for handwriting.
 - This is all voluntary and clients participating in the research cannot be charged. Participants would get training in the secret code and PRPP which is all evidence based.
 - Other members noted barriers in terms of funding and suggested looking into funding options to make this viable and increase interest.
 - Members suggested looking into research grants for example through the Rotary Club or Good Samaritans.
 - Members suggested looking into 4th year students through university clinics completing the research however reflected on the impact this may have on reliability of the results as often at least 1 year of experience and professional registration is often required to complete research.

- Member reported the Elizabeth Clinic run great parenting groups based on the Light House Program and would be suitable for referrals for clinical psychology for anxiety or parenting support regarding being present with your child. Could be suitable for upcoming Professional Development.

6. THE GOOD THE BAD AND THE UGLY

- Phlat ball - Available from Big W for about \$20. Can throw it like a frisby and catch it like a ball.

- Light up Ball Available from Big W for about \$3. Bounce and it lights up.
- Squishies Available online, price varies. Memory foam animals that start out large and squish down small.
- Magnetic shoelaces Available online for about \$10 \$15. Laces snap together rather than being tied. Member tried them out personally and found them easy to fasten however some practice required to get the right pressure. Noted that they occasionally unfastened when the heel is lifted for example when stepping into the car. Would be suitable for children with DCD or poor hand strength.
- Other methods of teaching children to tie their laces discussed and included:
 - Placing the laces in the extra hole at the top of the shoe to create two loops and then tying these loops.
 - Tying one knot, creating two loops and then tying the loops.
 - Using two different coloured laces to increase visual discrimination or using different textures to support tactile discrimination.
